Michael Peroutka's Visit to Utah a Tremendous Success

Michael Peroutka's visit to Utah exceeded our fondest expectations in almost every aspect. The only goal we had that did not materialize to our level of hope was that of larger audiences. However, the enthusiasm of the crowds that did attend made up for the shortfall in numbers. We feel certain that any future visits of Peroutka to Utah will result in far larger crowds.

The two evening meetings, first in Ogden, Utah at the Ben Lomond High School, and the following evening at Utah Valley State College in Orem, Utah drew a total of 330 people. During the day of his first visit Peroutka spoke to small gatherings in Tremonton, Utah and then was granted a radio interview at KVNU in Logan, Utah. The interview, broadcast at a later date, was conducted by Jeanne Christiansen, the most popular talk show host on the most popular radio station in Cache County—Utah's fifth most populous county. The following day Peroutka spoke at Snow College, a two-year college in Ephraim, Utah, where a prominent citizen, Rich Wheeler, assistant to the college president, welcomed him. He was a stand-in for the college president, who was out of town on another assignment. Mr. Wheeler stayed for the entire event and was noticeably impressed by what he heard and saw. He welcomed Mr. Peroutka and the Constitution Party back to the college anytime. During his two-day visit Peroutka spoke to just under 400 Utah citizens. His total audience exceeded that of Vice President Dick Cheney, who spoke at a fund raising event for GOP congressional hopeful John Swallow in Salt Lake City on Tuesday.

Peroutka's message was exceptionally well received everywhere he spoke. It soon became clear at the first event in Ogden that all of the yards signs would have been snatched up by the audience had some signs not been held back for visits to Sanpete and Utah Counties the following day. Some people were so disappointed at not

getting a yard sign that the Peroutka people relented and dipped into the reserve supply intended for the Utah and Sanpete Counties. The lecture series on the Constitution sponsored by Michael Peroutka and Don Dwyer were all sold out the first evening and the number of back orders taken exceeded the number of kits sold. Many people left their names and addresses with the party so they could be added to the list of those who receive the Utah CP newsletter.

Probably the highlight of Mr. Peroutka visit was the evening spent at UVSC in Orem. The audience was extremely receptive, and after the meeting many lingered to stay and meet Peroutka personally and shake his hand in thanks for the message that he delivered.

They seemed genuinely appreciative that there is finally a presidential candidate that they can vote for in good conscience. His message clearly resonated with many of their personally held views. Among the press who were present was Amie Rose of the Daily Herald, Utah's third or fourth largest newspaper. She wrote a very favorable article that appeared on the front page of the newspaper the following day along with a photo of Peroutka. The paper circulation covers a number of counties. In addition to this, a reporter from the Daily Universe, the newspaper of Brigham Young University, also interviewed Peroutka. A link from our CP Utah web site to the Daily Herald has been made so visitors to the site can read the article. At least three weekly newspapers interviewed Michael: The Tremonton Leader, The Sanpete Messenger in Manti, Utah, and The Pyramid in Mt Pleasant, Utah.

On Wednesday morning, 28 July, Mr. Peroutka was granted an audience with the Public Affairs Department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He, along with Don Dwyer, member of the Maryland State Assembly, and those with them, were welcomed by Dale Bills, Manager, Media Relations, and William S. Evans of the Public Affairs Department. The Church representatives were very gracious and asked Mr. Peroutka and delegate Don Dwyer numerous questions. They asked Mr. Peroutka how the people of Utah had received him. Peroutka's response was of course very positive. Seldom has he met such an enthusiastic and openly receptive group of people.

Many people came forward after each meeting and volunteered to

become involved with the Constitution Party. As a result of the visit the Constitution Party is being organized in at least two more counties—Morgan County in northern Utah and Uintah County in eastern Utah. People who came to hear Peroutka out of respect for neighbors and friends who had invited them came away from the meeting just elated to find candidates and a party that they could support in the up-coming election. These people were not just independents but active members of both the Democratic and Republican Parties. Peroutka's visit was mentioned over and over again as a "breath of fresh air". It is doubtful that many people at all left any of the meetings uncommitted to supporting Peroutka in November. The response he received was certainly heart warming to CP leaders.

Constitution Party Presidential Candidate Michael Peroutka to Return to Utah

You have read the headline right! Michael Anthony Peroutka has confirmed that he will return to Utah to promote his own campaign and also the campaigns of a growing list of local, state and federal Constitution Party candidates who have filed and who are continuing to file for office in the November General Election. News of his return trip to Utah is spreading quickly via word of mouth and the Internet. Mr. Peroutka visited Utah for the first time July 26th to July 28th and was very well received. During his swing through the state he spoke in Tremonton, Logan, and Ogden, Utah on the 26th. The following day he spoke at Snow College and then traveled to Manti and Mt. Pleasant where he held brief newspaper interviews. That evening he spoke to an extremely warm and receptive audience in Orem, in the UVSC Sorensen Student Center Grand Ballroom. Peroutka was well received everywhere he traveled. The Daily Herald gave the event front-page coverage the following day.

During his upcoming visits Peroutka will have repeat appearances in Ogden, Ephraim and Orem. However, in addition to these locations, he will also be giving evening speeches in Vernal and Cedar City. Please refer to the flyer in the newsletter for details of the date, time and location of each of his appearances. We encourage you to make copies of the flyers to share with friends and family. Because of the tremendous reception that Peroutka received during his first trip to Utah, he has included Utah as one of his key states to campaign in. Other key states include Alaska, Florida, Alabama, Pennsylvania and Maryland as well as other specific locations in the Southern States.

State Chairman Frank Flockier feels that the state is extremely

fortunate to be selected as one of Peroutka's key states, especially since the Constitution Party is so very new to the state. The party obtained ballot position in February of this year, making this the first year any candidates will appear on the Constitution Party ballot in Utah. As of the writing of this newsletter, Michael Peroutka has gained ballot position in 32 states with a total of 325 electoral votes and he expects to be on the ballot in at least 40 and possibly 41 states by the November General Election. This is a remarkable achievement for a new political party that was founded in 1992 by Howard Phillips and other conservative Republicans that finally came to the hard realization that the leadership of the Republican Party was bent on taking over the entire platform of the Democratic Party. Looking back over the last 12 years, they have been sadly accurate in their assessment of where the GOP was heading.

In all, Peroutka will be speaking at four evening events in Ogden, Vernal, Cedar City, and Orem, Utah. Tickets can be purchased over the Internet through the Constitution Party Web site at www.cputah.org, or by sending a check to the Constitution Party, P.O. Box 1215 Bountiful, UT 84010. Tickets will also be available at the door. Those who purchase tickets in advance through the Internet or the Post Office Box will receive a DVD introducing Michael Peroutka. We encourage you to order early, view the DVD and then share it with friends and neighbors and encourage them to in turn order tickets. Suggested donations are \$5.00 for adults and \$12.00 for families, but no one who wishes to hear Mr. Peroutka will be turned away. It is widely expected that attendance at his next visit will quadruple the attendance of his initial visit to Utah.

Vote Republican = More Illegal Immigrants

Interesting story in the "Washington Times" (8/23/04) headlined: "GOP To Finesse Immigration Issue" --- the applicable definition of "finesse" here being, in this context, to trick or use fraud. Or, some might say, to lie. So, about what, exactly, is it the GOP is going to use trickery or fraud or lies, to deceive us? Illegal immigration.

This story, based on an interview with Sen. Bill Frist (R-Tenn.), Chairman of the Republican Platform Committee, reports Frist as predicting that the GOP Platform will oppose amnesty for illegal aliens but not oppose a proposal advocated by President Bush --- which is, of course, an amnesty.

On January 7 of this year, Mr. Bush proposed a so-called immigration "reform" which would allow millions of illegal aliens in our country to remain in the country as guest workers for renewable three-year periods if they have jobs. These illegal aliens could eventually apply for permanent legal residence.

The "Washington Times" says the President's plan has "deeply angered" many Republicans and it has not been well received by some of Mr. Bush's closest friends and allies. For example, Sen. Zell Miller (D-Ga.), who will deliver the keynote address at the Republican Convention, says: "I'm trying to understand it. But, to me illegal means illegal." He says he's having a hard time reconciling the Bush plan with our being "a nation of laws."

Never a Better Time to Vote Third Party than in 2004

This year's presidential election provides one of the most unusual opportunities ever for building a viable third party. Why is this so? One merely has to review the logistics of the campaign to understand why. There are only 19 states in which either Kerry or Bush plan to do much campaigning. Those 19 states are Arkansas, Arizona, Florida, Iowa, Louisiana, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Washington, Wisconsin and West Virginia. The remaining 31 states are either so heavily in favor of Bush or Kerry that neither candidate intends to spend time campaigning in those states.

The news media focus heavily upon the popular vote, but this has little relevance in the outcome of the final election in each state since it is the electoral vote that is critical and not the popular vote. For example, Utah could give Bush only 34% of the popular vote and he would still get all five of Utah's electoral votes. This situation is ideal for the growth of a third party in the 31 states that either Bush or Kerry is taking for granted.

Utah is one of the best examples of this situation. Our state is so heavily republican that *any* candidate running on the GOP ticket would win the electoral votes here. A democratic presidential candidate has not won the popular vote in Utah since former U. S. Senator Barry Goldwater lost to Lyndon Johnson in 1964. That was 40 years ago!!! [A vote for Bush in Utah by someone who is dissatisfied with what Bush has done is very much a wasted vote, since it would take more than a miracle for him to lose the state's electoral votes.](#) The same is true of a vote for Kerry since he has no chance of winning Utah's five electoral votes either. Therefore

the most effective vote that an unhappy voter can cast in Utah (whether a Reagan Democrat, Independent or Republican) is a vote for Peroutka and the other statewide and local Constitution Party candidates. A *sizable* Constitution Party vote is the only effective way to send a clear message to the Republican Party leadership that Utah voters are displeased with the direction their party has taken. In fact, that is the only message that the leftist GOP leadership in Utah can understand. *Comments from current GOP leaders indicate, for example, that they really believe their views and policies are conservative.* Obviously they are deceived or are attempting to mislead their party members. Perhaps the greatest danger here is that party members, who, as a whole represent the mainstream thinking of the average Utah voter, apparently are unable to distinguish between what their leaders are saying and what they are doing. Hence they continue to support candidates and policies that do not represent their views. True conservatives can see just how far amiss these GOP leaders are from the thinking of their constituents.

The argument of voting for the lesser of two evils carries no weight in states like Utah, or in states like California where Bush has no chance at all of winning the electoral vote. In Utah a vote for Kerry is as much of a wasted vote as is a vote for Bush in California. The political pros understand this very well, but continue to foster the false idea of voting for the lesser of two evils because they realize that a majority of the public still falls for this argument.

A further flaw in the logic of prevailing politicians is that they assume that everyone who enters the voting booth is going to vote for the GOP or the Democratic candidate if no other candidate is on the ballot. Again, voting records do not bear this out. In the 2002 U. S. Congressional races there were over 10,000 Utah voters who voted but did not cast a vote for any of the U. S. Congressional candidates. The political pros are well aware of this fact, but choose to ignore it. They would prefer to lead the public on to believe that voters will always cast a vote for one or the other of the two major party candidates.

When one realizes that there are 31 states in which neither Kerry nor Bush plans to campaign because the apparent winner is already a forgone conclusion, the opportunity for the rise of a third party in this year's election is exciting. We just have to think outside the box of illogical thinking promoted by the politicians that the popular vote is all-important. Lincoln lost the popular vote and still was elected president in 1860 as a third party candidate, but the GOP conveniently forgets to mention this in today's political world. Never has there been a greater opportunity to build a new viable political party, and the power to take

advantage of this opportunity lies in the hands of millions of disillusioned American voters.

Never, in the minds of some astute political observers, has there been a better qualified and dedicated third party candidate running for the office U. S. President than Michael Anthony Peroutka. Truly he represents the conservative views of mainstream Utah and other western states voters, many of who are disillusioned and disgusted with what is going on in the publicized political arena. Working together, we in

The Western States, and especially in Utah, can make a pivotal difference. As we succeed, other states will follow us. This year will be a building year, but it will also be a watershed year. Let us unite, for united effort is the surest way to make that difference. In the future, we will be able to look back at the year 2004 and know that our decision to stick to our guns and vote for candidates such as Michael Peroutka—who, who truly represent our Godly desires by promoting correct principles of good government—was, a decision that reversed the destructive course our nation has been following for the past 50 years.

Constitution Party Now on the Ballot in 36 States

Since our last newsletter, 18 more states, Alabama, Arkansas, Connecticut, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington and Wyoming have gained ballot access for the Constitution Party. This brings the total number of states in which the CP has ballot position to 36. In addition to these states, one more state, New Hampshire has completed the signature gathering process and is awaiting official approval from the secretary of state office. Four other states, Hawaii, Louisiana, North Dakota and Rhode Island are still gathering signatures. States that had already qualified are Alaska, California, Colorado, Delaware, Florida, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, South Carolina, South Dakota, Utah, Vermont, and Wisconsin. The total electoral vote of the 36 states with ballot access is 380. The states of Georgia, Texas and West Virginia are certified to have write-in ballots counted and efforts are being made to have three more states, Arizona, Illinois and Massachusetts qualified for write-in ballot status.

In New Mexico, the state claimed that the party did not have enough signatures of valid registered voters, but the CP leaders challenged that position. When all was said and done, the state determined that the party did in fact have enough signatures. An

identical situation occurred in New Mexico in the 2000 election. At this point in time the Libertarian Party is on the ballot in 41 states and the Green Party in 27. Ralph Nader is on the ballot in 16 states. As of now it looks quite certain that the Constitution Party will be on the ballot in more states than the Green Party. They have missed the filing deadline in thirteen states while the CP has missed the deadline in nine and in the District of Columbia.

Nevada Party shows impressive Growth

The Nevada affiliate of the Constitution Party is the Independent American Party. Between Jan 31, 2004 and May 31, 2004 the party gained 2,897 new registered voters bringing the party's total registered voters to 19,167, according to the Nevada Secretary of State. This was an increase of 17.80%. The Republican Party registration grew from 352,730 to 358,321 for an increase of 5,591 or just 1.60%. The Libertarian Party grew by 181 members to 4,973 for a gain of 3.70% and the Democratic Party Grew by 8,687 to 352,730 for a gain of 2.60%. The over all voter registration increased by only 2.30% so it is apparent that voters are taking an increased interest in third parties. The rapid growth of the IAP ought to be a matter of concern to the DEMO-GOP Party.

Alaska Independence Party Promotes Peroutka

Things are beginning to look good for Constitution Party Candidate Michael Peroutka in the state of Alaska. A gubernatorial candidate for governor was actually elected to office on the Alaska Independence Party and now the party is enthusiastically endorsing the candidacy of Peroutka. Mr. Peroutka will appear on the ballot under the name of the Alaska Independence Party. The party sent three delegates to the CP National Nominating Convention in Valley Forge, PA to cast their state's votes for Peroutka. Like other candidates that have run under the party's banner and garnered respectable votes, the party leaders expect Peroutka to also do exceptionally well in the state. The AIP endorsement of Peroutka came as a surprise to the Constitution Party leaders, but they are nevertheless very grateful for the party's endorsement.

Peroutka Doing Surprisingly well in National Mock Election Poll

Dave Leip's Atlas of U.S. Presidential Elections is sponsoring a national presidential poll on its web site:
http://www.uselectionatlas.org/USPRESIDENT/GENERAL/CAMP_AIGN/2004/mock04.php The poll is relatively new and the program is designed to allow a voter to only vote once. Every candidate who

has filed for office of president is listed on the ballot including a choice for other and write-ins. Bush, Kerry, Badnarik and Nader were all listed with a separate color code, but Peroutka was assigned a color code identical to all of the other candidates listed on the ballot. The voter votes by state and therefore the electoral vote is tabulated by state.

What is interesting is that as of the printing of this newsletter, Michael Peroutka is in fourth place and is currently winning the states of Idaho, Alaska, Colorado, Utah and Montana giving him a total of 24 electoral votes. He stands in second place in the states of Missouri, Mississippi, Alabama and South Carolina. Peroutka's strong showing is somewhat of a surprise since he was not given a separate color code. It is interesting that Peroutka's greatest strength is in the West and the South. We encourage you to take a moment to check out the web site and cast your vote for Peroutka. Someone from the CP in another state brought this poll to our attention. We appreciate their doing so.

Where Do the Constitution Party Candidates Stand on Issues Important to Utahns?

The question is often asked of Constitution Party candidates where they stand on certain issues of concern to Utahns. Below is a brief summary of some our candidate's stand on a number of issues. Please visit CPUtah.org for additional topics and details.

Education

We uphold the 10 th Amendment to the US Constitution, and support the proposed legislation (now on hold for further review of impact) of Representative Margaret Dayton that the State of Utah un-subscribe from the Federal "No Child Left Behind" Act. We deplore the fact that the Federal Department of Education was brought into Utah three times by Utah's own federal level representatives to Lobby to our State Legislature against un-subscribing to NCLB. We support Home Schooling, Private, and Charter Schools, and we support total parental freedom of choice relative to the education of their children.

Immigration

We oppose in state-tuition rates, or any taxpayer funded program for the support of anyone who is within our borders illegally. We oppose the issuing of driver's licenses, or acceptance of the Mexican issued "Metricula Card" as a valid form of identification or authorization for any form of taxpayer supported aid to non-citizens. We support a state level resolution to the Federal government opposing the United States' of America entrance in the proposed Free Trade Area of the Americas (FTAA), which is scheduled for

vote in early 2005. Not only is this a serious threat to state sovereignty, but also it is a direct threat to national sovereignty and to the Constitution itself. It puts regional government in control of the "migration" of workers, jobs, and the economy as a whole. It is a violation of the United States Constitution to put trade and commerce treaty authority in the hands of anyone but the US Congress. Thus, it is unconstitutional to allow United States commerce and trade interests to be legislated and controlled by outside, regional government based authorities. To vote for such legislation is a violation of one's Oath of Office to protect and defend the Constitution of the United States, and the Constitution of the State of Utah.

Public Lands

We believe that all property concerns are either the domain of the individual or the state, as per the 10 th Amendment, and the federal government has no right to confiscate or coerce owners into selling or using lands in ways that the government feels, should be "protected". This includes, but is not limited to, national parks, national monuments, wilderness designated areas, and preserves. Private ownership of property is the preferred method for preserving these lands. Since approximately 70% of the state of Utah is owned by the Federal government, we request that these lands be returned to the domain of the state to be managed in the capacity we feel is most effective.

Two State House Candidates File as Write-ins in Support of Constitution Party

Because the Utah Constitution Party secured ballot position just weeks before the candidate deadline for filing for political office, most of the current members of the party had never even heard of the Constitution Party in February. With the growth of the party a number of people who have since joined the party have expressed interested in running for office. They fully realize that running for office is the most effective means of introducing others to the party. The interest for running for office seemed to hit a new high with the visit of presidential candidate Michael Peroutka to Utah in July.

By state law the only avenue such person have for running for office is as independent write-in candidates. During the month of August two such men filed with the state to run as write-ins for the state legislature. They are Wallace "Wally" McCormick of Holladay who is running in state house district #37 and Craig Laurence of Lehi who is running for state house district #56 in Lehi. Each candidate was asked to send in a short summary of why he joined the Constitution Party and why he is running for office.

Craig Laurence: write-in candidate for state house district #56

The main reason I am running for office is that I do not believe families and churches alone are going to prevent the moral decay in America. Government officers must join the battle to restore our Republic to the strength we once had when we were quick to remember God. Our nation is divisive because it is no longer in God that we trust. We must remember Him always. I am a member of the Constitution Party because it is the only party that represents a true understanding of the priorities of government. That is, we as individuals are accountable for this nation's status. It is the only party willing to tell people they have responsibility. The prominent parties purchase votes through empty promises of personal prosperity that they are later not able to fulfill because they fail to recognize that prosperity is not a tax cut. Prosperity is a blessing from God for honoring His will, and it may or may not be monetary.
